Meetings

During 2023 – 2024 Kerala Hockey held Annual General Council, four special General Council meetings, three Executive Council meetings, three Technical Committee meetings and three Selection Committee meetings on 18 August 2023.

Annual General Council 2022-2023

Honorable President Mr. Kerala Hockey Annual General Council meeting was held under the chairmanship of V Sunilkumar. General Secretary Shri. Presented by CT Soji.

Treasurer Mr. Ayyappan presented the auditors' report for the financial year 2022-23 for approval. He gave a detailed review of the auditors' report highlighting key figures and significant financial transactions. An analysis of income, expenses, assets and liabilities is included in the report. None of the participants raised objections or doubts. Therefore, the audit report was passed unanimously.

Protest rally to Secretariat against reduction of sportsmen's grace marks

On 10 May 2023, a protest rally was organized by the Kerala Hockey and Kerala Olympic Association at the Secretariat against the reduction of sports grace marks. Kerala Hockey President Shri. V Sunil Kumar, KOA General Secretary Shri. S. Rajeev, Arjuna award winners, all sportspersons and students participated.

Following a hugely successful protest rally, on 11 May 2023, the Department of Public Education amended its earlier order to grant grace marks to students of SSLC and higher secondary

examinations for participating in various co-curricular activities. The sharp cut in grace marks in the category comes amid widespread complaints by student-athletes in the sports department. As amended.

According to the new order, a student who participates in national level sports competitions will get 22 marks. In the earlier order, marks were awarded only to medalists in national competitions and not for participation. According to the new order, 30 marks will be awarded to students who have won medals in international competitions. 28 marks will be given to the participants in international sports competitions. The State Child Rights Commission took cognizance of the student-athletes' complaint and asked the Secretary and Director of Public Education to appear in person on May 11 to explain the reason for reducing the grace marks.

The order also amended the grace marks for the National and State level participants in Children's Science Congress.

International Olympic Day Celebrations 2023

Upholding the "Let's Move Initiative" of the International Olympic Committee, Kerala Hockey celebrated the Olympic Day under the auspices of the Kerala Olympic Association (KOA). The entire state of Kerala was in a sports frenzy throughout the week starting from June 19.

All 14 districts celebrated the Olympic Week under the auspices of the District Olympic Associations, concluding with the Olympic Run on June 23.

Apart from various activities across the state, around 60,000 people joined the Olympic Run in the districts and around 15,000 people from all walks of life joined the Olympic Run on June 23 in the state capital Thiruvananthapuram.

The support we have received from the Government of Kerala, other Government and Private Institutions, Educational Institutions, Police Departments, Military & Para Military Forces, Technocrats, Chambers of Commerce and other business communities reaffirms the strength of sports.







Hockey sticks supplied by Hockey India

Hockey India provided free sports equipment worth more than 40 lakh rupees in the market. Hockey India provided 437 hockey sticks, 4 goalkeeper kits and safety equipment. Kerala Hockey has decided to distribute hockey sticks to eligible players in the state. The distribution took place at the closing ceremony of the 8th Kerala Hockey Senior Men's Championship held at New Hockey Stadium, Kollam on 27 June 2023. We have distributed 437 sticks to eligible players in the following categories:

2. Winners, Runners Up and First Runners Up Teams: Sticks were awarded to the winning, runner up and first runner up teams in all categories of the 8th Kerala Hockey State Championship.

Hockey India held its 100th Executive Board meeting on Thursday 10 August 2023, reiterating its commitment to the growth and development of hockey in the country. Executive Board Member and Kerala Hockey President Mr. V Sunilkumar participated.

Hockey India President Padma Shri Dr. Dilip Tirkey, Hockey India Secretary General Shri Bhola Nath Singh and Hockey India Treasurer Shri Shekhar J Manoharan held a historic gathering to discuss critical issues shaping the future of the sport. International Hockey Federation (FIH) President Dato' Tayyab Ikram and Asian Hockey Federation (AHF) President Fumio Ogura were also present at the momentous occasion and both were honored with commemorative mementos.

Beginning with the Far Eastern Championship Games in 1913, the games marked the 110th anniversary since the creation of the first continental event.

Hockey India has nominated Shri V Sunilkumar, Executive Member of Hockey India as an observer to witness the 19th Asian Games Hockey matches of the Indian Men's and Women's Teams in Hangzhou, China.

India won the gold medal in the renewed 19th Asian Games Hangzhou 2022 men's hockey competition on the final day and also qualified for the @PARIS2024 Olympics.

13th Hockey India Congress 2023

The 13th Congress of Hockey India was held on Friday, November 3, 2023 at Marang Gomke Jaipal Singh Astro Turf Hockey Stadium Meeting Hall. On behalf of Kerala Hockey, President Mr. V. Sunilkumar, Mr. CT Soji, Kerala Hockey General Secretary, Smt. Sini Varghese also participated in the Congress.

The Congress announced several important decisions and initiatives to boost the sports sector in the country. In a groundbreaking move to strengthen its state member units, Hockey India has decided to award a prize of Rs 10.00 lakh to each member unit that wins medals in the Hockey India National Championship held throughout the year 2023. During the Congress, Hockey India decided to provide financial assistance to its member units to participate in the Hockey India National Championship. Under this initiative, each permanent state member unit participating in at least 4 out of 6 national championships will get support of Rs.1.50 lakh. Units participating in all the six national championships will get a substantial grant of Rs.9.00 lakhs. Similarly, 50% of Rs 1.50 lakh will be given to Associate State Member Units participating in each Hockey India National Championship. In addition to these initiatives, the Congress also focused on member unit compliance at state and district levels, underscoring Hockey India's commitment to good governance in the sport at all levels.

The committee plays an important role.

Proud Achievement: Grants received by Kerala Hockey from Hockey India 2023-2024

Being one of the first two state units in India to fulfill all the guidelines given by Hockey India at the state and district level and becoming the first member unit to get Rs 2 lakh for laptop and printer as a reward and becoming the first member unit to get Rs 10 lakh for fully fulfilling the guidelines of Kerala Hockey and other district hockey associations. Seen as an achievement. These funds are critical to the maintenance and improvement of our infrastructure and championships.

Kerala Hockey has qualified for a grant of Rs.9 lakh due to its active participation in all six categories of the 13th Hockey India National Championship.

20,000/- each to the district units Hockey India has announced to fulfill their respective district's route documents. Kerala Hockey is proud to see that all 14 district units of Kerala Hockey have successfully met these requirements.

In light of this, Hockey India has been requested to deposit the above grant amount into the designated bank accounts of the District Units of Kerala Hockey.

Kerala Hockey considers it a proud achievement to be eligible for these grants.

Kerala Hockey Future Plans

These are the exciting future projects of Kerala Hockey aimed at raising the skill level of hockey players across Kerala.

The state team participating in national competitions will have special training sessions conducted by Hockey India coaches from 2024-2025.

We are planning to conduct hockey coaching and technical courses across Kerala with 14 districts divided into three zones, South Central and North. These courses are designed to motivate players and enhance their skills in the sport of hockey.

This year we will be conducting a drag-flicking coaching course in association with Hockey India.

Kerala's pride and Indian goalkeeper P.R. Under the leadership of Sreejesh, a goalkeeping course will be organized in collaboration with Hockey India.

As part of the expansion of the grassroots training programme, a district-wise inter-school championship (Under 12 and Under 14) will be organized for the academic year 2024-2025 in collaboration with the Olympic Association on the occasion of the 2024 Olympic Day.

Develop a distribution plan to provide free hockey sticks to 100 selected schools under the grassroots training program initiative.

Kerala Hockey will constitute a "special body" to evaluate the grassroots training program in NIV in 297 schools under the grassroots training program initiative. Evaluate the effectiveness of hockey coaches and senior players involved in training. Areas for improvement will be identified and necessary support will be provided to improve the training program.

Considering the state government's 'Vision 2024' plan envisaged for the development of sports in Kerala, in a phased manner in the state

'Kerala Hockey' plans to formulate a long-term hockey development program to grow the game of hockey.

This project "Back to School" is to revive the game of hockey from middle school to higher secondary

level in the state. To initiate this project, the governing body of Kerala Hockey has formulated a plan to start hockey coaching in 600 selected schools in 14 districts from Thiruvananthapuram to Kasaragod. Under this project, in the first three years 'Kerala Hockey' will introduce the game in 200 schools across the state in 600 schools in three consecutive years. It is also planned to make all the taluks of Kerala compulsorily equipped with international standard infrastructure through this scheme.

'Kerala Hockey' assesses that the fact that there are three pillars for the development of hockey in the state in the future cannot be denied.

- o Youth Development
- o Enhance skills and technical knowledge
- o Infrastructure development

The socio-economic impact of sports and the need to promote a 'sports culture' within the education system

The need and focus is key, making it a viable career option for those inclined towards sports. With adequate support of planning and focused implementation, the immense potential of the youth of the state can be harnessed through sports activities. Realization of their true potential not only builds future character but also helps in national integration. More importantly, our students are from different geographical areas of the state with limited sports infrastructure, which can attract them to this scheme and thus make them beneficiaries of this scheme.

'Kerala Hockey' is confident that the successful completion of this project will revive the game of hockey in the state within five years and players from national and international levels will bring benefits to our state.

In order to increase the training infrastructure, it is necessary to establish at least three training pitches in the state especially in Ernakulam, Thrissur and Kozhikode districts. The only existing hockey stadium in Kollam is currently used by Sports Council hostel students and local players.

This leaves a void for other district players. Submitting more pitches to other districts will facilitate more accessible and widespread training opportunities. For that purpose, Kerala Hockey, along with Hockey India, will hold discussions and efforts with the Government.

As discussed earlier, Kerala Hockey is planning to implement 5's A side Hockey Premier League (ten day league with 120 matches) for the year 2024-2025.

Conclusion

The year 2023-24 is an important period for Kerala Hockey and as the report concludes, Kerala Hockey Treasurer Shri. Ayyappan Kerala Hockey Players, Coaches, Selectors, Umpires, Technical Officers, All Affiliated Member Units, Executive and General Body Members, Kerala Sports Council, Sportsmen, Kerala Olympic Association, Finance Officer Shri. Binu, Kerala Hockey Office Administrators Shri. Subha, Mr. Seena, Mr. Kerala Hockey also appreciates and acknowledges Ronnie Reynolds. Their support and dedication is the driving force behind the successful functioning of the Association, enabling Kerala Hockey to thrive and grow.


